Manage ordering of uniforms and various Club apparel. Assist with sales of merchandise at Club welcome night and Grub at the Club. Assist with purchasing of training/football department equipment.

Currently Performed By: Chris Goodman. Chris will no longer have a child playing at Oakleigh Dragons in 2024, and as such leaves the Committee. This role must be filled for Season 2024. There are detailed handover documents, and a number of Committee Members with exposure to the role to provide assistance. Chris will of course be happy to help with queries as well!

SOCIAL CO-ORDINATOR

Arrange and co-ordinate a variety of social events for Club members together with volunteers. **Currently Performed By:** VACANT. 2023 was the first season we haven't had a social function for some time. The Club wants this role filled to assist in ensuring we keep our Club focus continuing as a family-friendly, community Club in 2024.

WEBSITE / SOCIAL MEDIA CO-ORDINATOR

Maintain and update Club website, assist with ad hoc IT matters and manage and monitor social media. **Currently Performed By:** Kathy McGeoch. Kathy has filled multiple roles on the Committee for many years and is seeking to step back in her responsibilities in 2024. She will still be available to assist with the transition of these roles in 2024. No advanced technical/IT knowledge required.

COMPLIANCE OFFICER

Monitors and ensures appropriate volunteer qualifications including Working with Children Checks, Coaching and First Aid qualifications are uploaded into the League specified database.

Currently Performed By: Kathy McGeoch. As noted above, Kathy has filled multiple roles on the Committee for many years and is seeking to step back in her responsibilities in 2024. She will still be available to assist with transition of this role in 2024.

SCAMMELL GROUND MANAGER


Responsible for the smooth running of game day at Scammell. Conduct initial ground/club room inspections at home matches. Report on any maintenance deficiencies (and assist to address where possible) and liaise with the ground-markers to ensure line markings are clear. Ensure the scoreboard is operational. Ensure goal post pads are up before the start of play. Monitor team cleanup at the close of play, noting that the club room clean-up is the responsibility of each team playing on the day, NOT the Ground Manager. While this can be a non-Committee Role, your attendance at Committee meetings may be required on an ad hoc basis. Presence is not required at Scammell all day.

Currently Performed By: These responsibilities are currently undertaken by Brodie and Caz, the Club President and Secretary respectively. The President and Secretary roles are an enormous responsibility, taking up a significant portion of time. In a standard season there are just 15 days of football played at Scammell Reserve. One person, assisting with these tasks for just a few hours on just 15 days of the year would greatly assist to spread the workload.

PRINCES HIGHWAY GROUNDS OFFICER

Conduct risk assessment of playing fields at home matches. Manage any maintenance deficiencies. Organise the marking of ground lines. Ensure scoreboard and timekeeper equipment is available. Ensure goal post pads are up. Can be a Non-Committee Role, attendance at Committee meetings required on an ad hoc basis.

Currently Performed By: VACANT. The Club works to liaise with the SMJFL to avoid use of Princes Highway Reserve where possible, to keep our Club based at Scammell. Games were played at Princes Hwy on just 9 Sundays in 2023. Someone committing to assist with this role for just 9 days of the year would again greatly help to ease the workload on the Committee. Could also be combined with the Scammell Ground Manager role.
