Often this pressure can manifest in disappointing on and off field behavioural issues. Poor behavior - including any directed at Umpires - won't be tolerated.

The SMJFL By-Laws have been amended for the 2023 Finals Series. Penalties will be doubled for reportable offences (including against Umpires) that occur during Finals.

The league seeks to provide kids with a safe, supportive and inclusive environment. This extends to the SMJFL Umpire Academy, of which approximately 85% are under the age of 18. A number of Oakleigh Dragons players also fill roles as SMJFL Umpires.

We want to support the Umpires, and stamp out unsavoury behavior. This is an important step in creating a better game day environment. As spectators, we must provide the right role model experience for our Players. Positive, encouraging support from the sidelines is always welcomed. Go Dragons!
