U11 MIXED JAI ROBERTSON

Sunday morning we took on Waverley Hawks in the Grand Final, we have had some huge battles against Waverley during the year with a goal separating the two sides every time.



Before the game we were all very excited as it is such a fantastic experience to be a part of. Pregame the messaging to our team did not change, we had got ourselves into a grand final by playing our brand of footy, which is a strong contested, pressure and defensive game.
