

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hey Dragons,

Firstly, a massive thank you to those who attended our session with Dr David Munro on Wednesday night. It was a fantastic opportunity to listen to an expert on concussion, and the feedback we received was extremely positive. As a result of this session, and the information gained from it, we are currently reviewing our concussion policy & guidelines. We'll let you know as soon as the updated guidelines are published on the website. We will also have a new head knock assessment tool for Trainers to use, which will likely provide more clarity on the decision of whether to sit players out or not during a game. David will also be making his slides available to us, so we will send those out via email once we have them. In summary, David told us that there is no global agreed definition of concussion. No objective measure for testing concussion. If in doubt, sit them out. We're not asking Trainers to diagnose concussion, but to identify whether there is a suspected concussion so that we decide whether the player can return to the field.

Congratulations to Adam Choucair on his 100th game! What a sensational milestone for you, Adam. We're super proud to be part of your footy journey & to have you celebrate this achievement at our Club!

Just a reminder about a couple of upcoming events which we're all excited about. Round 13 is August 10th and the Oakleigh Dragons JFC will be hosting the IKON Girls & Womens Round. This is the perfect round for us to host in the year that we have become a signatory on the Women & Girls Club Charter. The Clock can only be stopped for an injury during a match where the player cannot be removed from the ground AFTER a period equivalent to one quarter of the game has lapsed. For example if a player cannot be moved from the ground until an ambulance arrives.
